


#### Primary Teachers Strike Action Next Tuesday

New Zealand's principals and primary teachers have voted about what to do to get government action on the current crisis in recruiting and retaining teachers.

We're agreed - we can't in good conscience accept the Government's latest collective agreement offer because it does not begin to address the crisis. We have therefore voted for an unprecedented second strike. There will be nationwide rolling strikes over a week, and our region will be striking on

#### Tuesday 13 November

**Our school will be closed on that date**. While we regret the inconvenience we know this will cause, we need to send a clear message to the Government that we are standing strong for our students.

Already children's education is suffering because of the difficulty in recruiting teachers and relievers, and we must take bold steps to turn this around. The Government recently announced a \$5.5 billion surplus, so there is no reason to make our children wait while the situation deteriorates further.

Through our union, NZEI Te RiuRoa, we are asking for:

• Smaller classes, so our children can get more one-on-one attention

• More resources and staffing to adequately support children with additional learning needs – this will benefit all children because teachers will be freed to spend more one-on-one time with every student

• A significant increase in teachers' salaries so that they are properly valued for their qualifications and responsibilities, and as a country we can recruit and retain teachers.

## Principal's Message

What, week four already? Summer came and went then it's coming again! Rain and wind? Spring is great isn't it! Christmas stuff in the shops already!

Thanks to the parents who offered to help out with transportation for our **field trip to Hamilton today**. It's not often the whole school goes on a trip but to get enough transport for 86 children is pretty impressive! Support from home and the community is so important for rural schools!

I went to see **Nigel Latta** speak last week at a Waikato Principal Association Breakout Day. As well as offering research based information into what makes a difference to children he was very entertaining. Nigel quoted a snippet from the work by Professor John Hattie, a well known Educational researcher. Hattie's research pointed out what does and does not make a difference to children's educational success at school: **Don't really matter**; Family Structure, Ability grouping, Uniforms,

Co-ed v Single sex, Open v traditional classes and class size.

**Do Really matter:** Class climate, Teacher clarity, Peer Influences, Feedback, Micro teaching, Classroom behaviour and Acceleration. To top it all off "**Children's expectation of themselves"** is the biggest indicator as to how well they do at school! A quote I use all the time is: "If you believe you can or you can't do something, You are right!" Teachers need Empathy, Warmth, Encouragement and Fairness. Business and society need people who can Think critically, Communicate, Collaborate and who are Creative. More and more businesses are employing people with these skills rather than a University Degree!

Last Friday I went to the **Te Awamutu College Prize Giving** held at the Event Centre. I was very pleased to see a good number of ex Pukeatua Students receive awards for their hard work. Special mention must go to **Adriana Vasinca** who did all her primary schooling at Pukeatua School and was last Friday named **Dux** of Te Awamutu College as well as winning another trophy for all round excellence! We are all proud of her achievements and we all wish Adrianna well for the next stage in her life's journey!

**Teachers** are busy gearing up for the end of year. There is always lots of things to complete by the end of the year and there are important dates on the calendar as well. We look forward to your continued support!
