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


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








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BOARD & SCHOOL

Attendance

As part of our reporting to the BOT we report against attendance, this will also be reported to you in your child's report. We have a target attendance of 92% and above. We found this interesting breakdown when compiling the individual children's attendance rates.

The Ministry of Education attendance rates are as follows:

Absence Rates across the year:			
Acceptable	95%		10 days (2 weeks of school missed across the school year)
A concern	90%		20 days (4 weeks of missed school, one month)
Critical concern	85%	=	30 days (6 weeks of missed school, over half a term)
Very serious	80%		40 days (8 weeks of missed school, nearly one term)

Another interesting but scary fact - If your child misses one day a fortnight for various reasons, by the time they reach Year 10 they will have missed a whole year of schooling.

Absences do have a significant impact on a child's learning, please be mindful of this!
