



<u>Agricultural Day 2019</u>

It is with regret that, having received professional advice, it is strongly recommended that the Calf section of any Agricultural Day and Group Day be withdrawn from the programme due to the continual threat of the Mycoplasma bovis organism. The Board of Trustees have therefore made the decision to invite entries from Lambs and Kids only this year.

The following is from Dairy NZ:

No one wants to ban calf days; we know how much children and adults love the day. In this heightened time of biosecurity riisk, the danger of Mycoplasma bovis being spread from animal to animal must be considered. Ultimately if animals won't come into contact, then the risk of spread is low. The question that needs to be considered is how likely is that animals won't come into contact. DairyNZ and MPI agree that mixing young animals and then returning them to their home farm, is not worth the risk under the current state of heightened biosecurity in New Zealand. Children and animals don't always stick to plans!

We recommend that, while the Mycoplasma bovis eradication programme is underway, schools and those managing calf days, look for alternatives to calf day.
