Principal's Message

Half way through the term and we are wondering where the time has gone! The weather has been wet to say the least and it does make a difference when the sun comes



out! Along with the wet weather we have seen an increase in unwell children. Being inside for longer periods with others who may be infected does add to the problem. Plenty of little germs are floating around all over the place with the amount of sneezes and coughs you hear in a room each day!! If in doubt keep children home! Also in the news lately has been articles about Measles doing the rounds. Parents are being asked to check to see if children have had all the necessary inoculations and if in doubt check up! Children and adults who have not been immunised are being told to stay home from schools and preschools where cases have been confirmed! Touch wood nothing in our area!

Along with **sickness comes absences** from school. Last term our school submitted our attendance rates for that term. We had 60% of the school present for over 90 % of the time. That was lower than the national average and lower than other schools in the Waikato region. It may have been a bad term for sickness but a number of children do have days away for unjustified reasons. Greater than 90% attendance is less than 5 days off a term. Interesting fact, If a child has 5 days off a term (90% attendance) then that means they have 20 days off a year. In 10 years of schooling (year 10) they would have had the equivalent of one year away from school. (194 days, normal school year) Of course not many keep up that sort of average!

Last Thursday we hosted the **Eastern Zone Speech Finals** at our school. The numbers of entries were down a little this year for reasons listed above. Sick and injured! Our school was represented by **Emily Phillips** and **Madison Phillips** (Junior Section) and **Neo Molina** and **Benjamin Anderson** (Senior section.) All four children did themselves and the school proud! Neo won the Senior Section and Emily took out the Junior Section! Madison and Benjamin were very close behind the winners!

Tomorrow hopefully the Junior children are off to Wharepapa South School for the **Eastern Zone Winter Sports Day**. The juniors have missed out the last couple of years due to the weather! **Next Friday it is the Seniors turn at the same venue**! This week we also have had a visit from the **Fire Wise** people who run a programme for all the children. With house fires still a threat around the country a little education around the topic does come in handy!




